**DEFENDANTS' RESPONSE TO PLAINTIFFS'  
NOTICE OF SUPPLEMENTAL AUTHORITY**

Defendants hereby respond to Plaintiffs' Notice of Supplemental Authority. ECF No. 41. As that notice informed the Court, a motions panel of the Fifth Circuit granted plaintiffs' motion for an injunction pending appeal in *Mock v. Garland*, No. 23-10319 (5th Cir. May 5, 2023). However, contrary to Plaintiffs' contentions, the Fifth Circuit's unpublished order includes no reasoning or explanation for its decision, making it "impossible for this court to discern" that court's rationale. *See Doe v. Trump*, 284 F. Supp. 3d 1182, 1185 (W.D. Wash. 2018). In addition, as Plaintiffs note, the order limits the scope of the injunction to only plaintiffs in that case. ECF No. 41 at 1. Accordingly, the Fifth Circuit's order is neither binding on this Court, nor provides the Court with any guidance in resolving Plaintiffs' pending motion for a preliminary injunction. *See Northshore Development v. Lee*, 835 F.2d 580, 583 (5th Cir. 1988) ("[A] motions panel decision is not binding precedent."). Furthermore, while a preliminary injunction is not warranted in this case, the Fifth Circuit's order underscores that any injunction should apply only to the parties before the Court.
